



# TUTORING & WRITING CENTER

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The Center for Academic Success offers free tutoring and writing center support to traditional undergraduate, CU Online and seminary students. The Center for Academic Success is located in Verna Miller Hall, on the campus of Cornerstone University.

## **How do I sign up for tutoring and/or writing support?**

All students should inquire about services by emailing [academic.success@cornerstone.edu](mailto:academic.success@cornerstone.edu) or by calling 616.222.1595. Students may be asked to complete a brief email questionnaire to determine what service(s) will best suit their needs.

## **What classes can I receive tutoring or writing support in?**

Tutors are available for almost all classes either in-person or online, depending on the type of student classification you are, (i.e. traditional, online, or seminary).

## **Do I qualify for in-person tutoring?**

If you are a traditional undergraduate student, you may qualify for in-person tutoring based on your submitted class schedule and tutor availability. Most in-person tutoring sessions are scheduled between 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and occur in Verna Miller Hall. Miller Library can host tutoring sessions that must occur after 5pm weekdays. In-person tutoring sessions typically last one hour.

## **How does online tutoring work?**

For CU Online students, the Center for Academic Success partners with NetTutor, a 24/7 virtual tutoring service that allows students to receive free virtual tutoring for a wide variety of subjects. Traditional undergraduate students who are unable to schedule in-person tutoring may also be encouraged to utilize online tutoring services.

## **I'm a seminary student. Do I have access to tutoring and/or writing support?**

Yes! All seminary classes have a designated Peer Coach assigned to each course who can assist students throughout the semester. If you are interested in contacting the Peer Coach in one or more of your classes, you are encouraged to contact the faculty member teaching the course. Students interested in receiving Greek or Hebrew tutoring may receive additional support and should contact their course instructor for additional information.

The Writing Center within the Center for Academic Success hires designated seminary writing tutors to assist seminary students in their classes. These writing tutors are trained in Truabian/SBL writing style. Seminary writing tutoring will usually be conducted virtually.
